Keynote Presentation

Foundations of Restorative Practices Nancy Riestenberg


A restorative school is centered on relationships, building community and repairing harm. Multiple practices provide multi-tiered levels of support for students, staff and family. This one day session will provide an overview of restorative justice principles and theory, restorative practices in schools, implementation guidance, evaluation and research and a review of MDE resources to support school social workers.

<u>Objectives:</u> This session will provide participants with an overview of restorative measures principles and practices.

- 2. Explain 3 key principles and 4 practices of a restorative school

Nancy Riestenberg has over thirty-five years of experience in the fields of violence prevention, child sexual abuse prevention, and restorative measures in schools. She has worked with school districts in Minnesota and twenty five other states. As Restorative Practices Specialist for the Minnesota Department of Education, she provides technical assistance on violence and bullying prevention, school connectedness, school climate, dropout prevention, cultural relevance in prevention education, crisis prevention and recovery, and restorative measures. She has also provided technical assistance in restoring the learning environment to the Minnesota school districts that experienced high levels of trauma.

Nancy Riestenberg writes warmly and with long experience about the challenges facing school communities and how restorative measures—specifically Circles—create a safer space for learning and development for all. Throughout the book, Nancy's focus is on strategies that actually work for the whole school community: students, parents, administrators, teachers, and the community in which they live.
